* (Description)	<p>This course is designed to teach students about many of the cultural characteristics of various English speaking countries. The primary focus of the lessons will deal with Britain, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the United States. Students will learn about the shaping and changing of each culture. Study will involve a look at forms of government, marriage, death, music, entertainment, fashion, literature, holidays, religions and their influences on culture, sports and recreation, national symbols, and educational systems. Students will be required to speak only English in class, thus improving their English skills. Grading will be based upon written examinations, presentations, group and class participation, and assignment researching various aspects of these cultures. Students will present one group presentation in class. Assignments and activities are designed to improve the student’s knowledge and understanding of each country in an effort to better appreciate each.</p>
