<p style="text-align: center;">* Description</p>	<p>The Introduction to Interpretation (1) course is designed to equip students with the learning outcomes necessary to meet the basic needs of the interpretation profession. Students will be guided through: (a) the basic interpretation principles, including ethics and professional conduct, and the ability to apply it to practice; (b) specific interpretation techniques.</p> <p>The course emphasis is on practical training in interpretation, developing students' skills to a higher level. They will learn to do researches to identify, analyze, and resolve interpretation problems professionally while independently developing an efficient and rational approach to the process of interpretation.</p> <p>The course starts with lectures which will help students to understand the main principles of interpretation and a methodological framework for analyzing, discussing and justifying interpretation-related decisions. It is followed by case-by-case interpretation practices to hone the above-mentioned skills.</p> <p>Students are expected to have an improved understanding of the Chinese and English languages and cultures, enhance their interpersonal and intercultural skills and improve their professional and transferable skills.</p>
